Message from Past President: Norman Locke

Dear Portland Lodge C.A.C.A. members and friends:

The Kam Wah Chung Museum in John Day, OR has been designated a "Historic Landmark" by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. This Museum was built in 1864 as a trading post and bought in 1887 by Mr. Lung On, a businessman who was the first automobile dealer in Eastern Oregon and Dr. Ing Hay, a renowned practitioner of traditional and herbal medicine. This location was also a social center for the Chinese in the area.

When Doc Hay closed his practice in 1948, the building was locked for the next twenty years. His relatives donated the entire building and its contents to the town of John Day. Contents of the building contained many antiques; records of the local Chinese activities; business records; and many uncashed checks written to Doc Hay. The herbal contents are well preserved with about 650 different herbs in stock. Much work is required to preserve these artifacts. Translation is needed for much of the records.

Mary Oberst, Oregon's first Lady, has spearheaded fund raising for the restoration and preservation of this museum. She will be the guest speaker at our February 5, 2006 Chinese New Year dinner. Recently, The Department of Interior donated \$400,000 towards the restoration and preservation of this museum under the Interior's "Save America's Treasures" Historic Preservation Funds. As of today, only \$114,000 is needed to complete the goal of 1.5 million dollars, which was the targeted amount needed.

C.A.C.A. Portland Lodge can have its name on the wall of the museum if it can donate \$500. Since our treasury cannot afford this, we are hoping members and friends can donate towards this goal. Individuals can also have their names listed on the museum wall with donations of \$500 or more.

If you can, please make a check payable to "Oregon State Parks Trust", and mail to 2309 S.W. First #142, Portland, OR 97201, or bring a check to the dinner on February 5, 2006. Donations are fully TAX DEDUCTIBLE.

Finally, the Chinese American is officially recognized as being an important part of American history. We hope that you feel and understand the philosophical value and importance of such a project.
