On Sunday, March 28th, the CACA Dragons won the 2010 C.A.C.A. High School Tournament held at Oregon City High School. 2010 marks the third consecutive year the Dragons have won the C.A.C.A. HS Boys Basketball Tournament. The Dragons featured a mix of players from sophomores through seniors and are coached by Cyrus Lee with lead assistant coach Brian Do.

Portland Lodge Engages in Community Involvement

The 18th Annual Asian American Youth Leadership Conference was held on April 30, 2010 at Portland Community College. Close to 600 students from high schools in Portland and its surrounding cities including Vancouver, Washington attended the conference. For the first time, a group from Fremont, California joined the conference as well. The conference began with its second film festival that featured films of the top three winners that focused on the theme of the conference: Connecting Tomorrow's Leaders. The keynote speaker, Liani Reeves, Assistant Attorney General at Oregon Department of Justice shared her personal story that included triumphs and struggles from being an abandoned orphan to a successful leader in the community.

The C.A.C.A. Portland Lodge is among nine co-sponsors for this conference. The Planning Committee chaired by Paul Van Mai, along with 17 community members including Cyrus Lee, our lodge vice president as well as 52 facilitators and volunteers joined forces in ensuring all the programs were conducted as planned. Students participated in workshops that focused on leadership, culture, college/career, and urban ecology. The main goals for the conference were to impart leadership skills, to provide career guidance and opportunities, and to foster a strong sense of culture and self-pride among the attendees.

Partnering with 22 other organizations representing minority communities, Portland Lodge was involved in putting on two candidate forums that focused on the candidates' perspective on equity and accountability in our diverse communities.
